In the news!! Monday, 4th July, 1904

A young man named Emanuel C. Harvey met with a fearful death at Maylands on Saturday morning, as the result of a well, which he was sinking, falling in and burying him alive under several tons of sand and timber. The deceased for the past few days had been employed with a mate in sinking a well on the property of Mr. L. Moses, on the Old Guildford Road, Maylands. When work was commenced on Saturday morning a depth of about 50ft. had been reached. The ground in which the men were working is of a treacherous nature, being composed of loose, shifting sand, and consequently precautions were taken to timber the sides as the work of digging proceeded. Shortly after 10 a.m. Harvey called to his mate to pull up the bucket, and almost immediately the sides of the well broke away, and a mass of timber and sand fell in. The deceased, who was a single man, 27 years of age, was a well-known footballer. He played for the Union Club in the First Rate Association for some time, but was picked to take the place of the late James Gullan in the East Fremantle team in the match against Perth on Saturday afternoon. In 1900-1901 he worked as a miner at Cue, and was a member of the Fire Brigade. He was an exceedingly big man, being over 6ft. in height.
